- Chair virtual & occasional in-person committee meetings, in addition to a post-event analysis meeting
- Select and secure a Walk site in conjunction with ALS staff
- Develop and manage the budget for the Walk; ensure local expenses are paid, and all funds and pledge forms are forwarded to staff post-event
- Apply for all necessary permits and complete required paperwork
- Support staff with recruitment for volunteer Walk committee members and event day volunteers
- Guide committee members to accomplish tasks according to timelines
- Engage personal networks to develop potential partnerships, sponsorships and event participation
- Establish and build a strong, effective and constructive working relationship with staff leads and committee members
- Act as an ambassador for the cause and organization
