

POLICY: SCIENTIFIC MISCONDUCT AND FRAUD

Any institution that receives funds from ALS Society of Canada must have written policy guidelines on conflict of interest, scientific misconduct, and fraud. It is the responsibility of the Host Institution and the Grantee to inform the organizations immediately, in writing, of any institutional investigation into the conduct of an investigator whose work is supported by ALS Canada, and to keep them informed in a timely manner of the progress and outcome of such investigation. A finding by the institutional investigation that the investigator was guilty of research fraud or misconduct is sufficient grounds to terminate support of a project and may jeopardize future support for the investigator from ALS Canada and funding partners.
