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What You Will Do:

- **Greeter** – Greet and direct participants as they arrive at the event and answer participant questions.
- **Registration** – Process donations and event paperwork as required.
- **T-Shirt Volunteer** – Organize t-shirt table; distribute t-shirts to participants.
- **Food & Beverage Volunteer** – Organize food and beverages; distribute food and beverages to participants.
- **Route Marshals/Cheerleaders** – Organize signage along the walk route; direct, cheer and encourage participants along the walk route (3-5KM); remove walk route signage after the Walk has been completed.
- **Event Day Equipment Set-Up/Tear-Down**– Assist staff with setting up tables, chairs, tents, decorations, signage, etc. prior to the start of the event; assist with tearing down tables, chairs, tents, decorations, signage, cleaning up garbage and recycling, etc. after the event is finished.
- Other tasks as required.

**Please note that volunteers will be assigned roles as needed leading up to and on Event Day.
