- **Supporting the “Day in the Life Suite”** – Volunteers will guide attendees through various items relevant to individuals living with ALS that can promote greater independence. No prior experience is necessary, as a trainer will walk volunteers through the setup.
- **Additional Duties as Assigned** – Volunteers may be asked to undertake other responsibilities as required.

- **Volunteer shifts will consist of 4-6 hours per shift. Morning shifts from 7:30am to 12:30pm and afternoon shifts from 12:30 to 6:00pm.**
