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Ways you will help on event day:

- **Food & Beverage Volunteer** – Organize food and beverages; distribute food and beverages to participants.
- **Event Day Equipment Set-Up/Tear-Down** – Assist staff with setting up tables, chairs, tents, decorations, signage, etc. prior to the start of the event; assist with tearing down tables, chairs, tents, decorations, signage and cleaning up after the event is finished.
