- Photos should be taken at registration, kick-off, during the event, and during the post-event celebration.
- Photos should reflect the diversity of our community (age, gender, race, and role).
- Shot list to be appropriately utilized, provided before the event takes place.
- Images should convey the spirit of community, fun, and unity that happens naturally at ALS Canada events.
- Photography will be used for promotional and fundraising purposes, including recruitment and brand building on the website, social channels, and presentations.
